
### Hybrid Meeting Instructions for the Economic Development Authority Board








### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

Consistent with the adopted FY2024 budget for the East DDA District, the Township's engineering consultants at Gourdie-Fraser Associates were asked by the Community and Economic Development Director to provide construction oversight and to manage the construction bidding process for the Bud Street Sidewalk Extension Project.

The project was advertised for bid by Gourdie-Fraser in May of this year, with a closing date of May 22, 2024. Three (3) bids were received by the closing date to perform all work as specified in the Bidding documents, as follows:

A copy of each bid is included in the Board packet for your review.

### **EVALUATION**

All three (3) contractors are locally based, with Malley Construction located in our East DDA District and The Isabella Corporation located in our West DDA District. Two of the bids came in under the original Township Engineer estimate of \$70,000.00 for this project.

Based upon the information provided, including the review of bids and the Township's knowledge of Malley Construction's work on other public and private projects in the area, Gourdie-Fraser

has submitted a written recommendation for EDA Board acceptance of the Malley Construction bid of \$55,886.00 for completion of this project. This recommendation also has the full support of the Community and Economic Development Director.

The EDA Board has invested substantial resources in the establishment and maintenance of the network of public sidewalks in the East DDA District and in the recent renovations and improvements to Jameson Park and Jameson Hall. Our East DDA District sidewalk network is heavily used to provide year-round pedestrian access to businesses along the corridor. This project will further extend the regional network of public sidewalks to connect Jameson Park to our business district.

### **C**OSTS

Malley Construction has proposed completing the requested construction for a total fee of \$55,886.00. The funds for completion of this project are already included in the FY2024 budget for the East DDA Fund, which allocates a total of \$520,000.00 for all planned sidewalk construction projects in the East DDA District.

### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

For more than 15 years a publicly owned and operated underground irrigation system has been maintained along both sides of the E. Pickard Road (M-20) corridor within the East Downtown Development Authority District (EDDA). The purpose of the EDDA irrigation system is to provide water to hanging flower baskets on the streetlights along the M-20 corridor, to the flower baskets hung on the decorative wing walls of the US-127 interchange area, and to other planting beds and lawn areas along the M-20 corridor.

The original system extended from the Township border at S. Summerton Rd. west through the US-127 interchange area to the border with the City of Mt. Pleasant just east of Packard St. In 2023, the portion of this system west of the US-127 interchange was removed as part of the complete reconstruction of this section of M-20 by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT).

As part of the reconstruction, MDOT reinstalled PVC conduit in all the reinstalled streetlight foundations and under all the driveways to facilitate future reinstallation of this system. The remaining part of this irrigation system within and to the east of the US-127 interchange was not significantly affected by the road reconstruction and remains in operation.

In response to the EDA Board's direction during your May meeting, staff put together and advertised a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) to invite irrigation design professionals to submit their qualifications for consideration to provide advisory services to help the EDA Board identify and prioritize necessary design elements and preferred features and controls for the planned reinstallation of the underground irrigation system in the area impacted by the 2023 road construction. The RFQ was published in The Morning Sun, posted on the Township's website, and sent directly to a number of professionals as recommended to the Township.

### **EVALUATION**

Two (2) firms responded to the Township's RFQ advertisement by submitting their qualifications for consideration to provide the requested irrigation design advisory services:

Based on the information provided, it is the recommendation of the Director that Graber & Associates, LLC (Geoff Graber) be selected as the preferred firm to provide the requested advisory services.

Pickard Rd. (M-20) corridor from west of the US-127 interchange to Packard St.

For more than 15 years the EDDA has maintained a publicly owned-and-operated underground irrigation system along both sides of the M-20 corridor from the Township border at S. Summerton Rd. west through the US-127 interchange area to the border with the City of Mt. Pleasant just east of Packard St. The purpose of this EDDA irrigation system is to provide water to hanging flower baskets on the streetlights and on the decorative wing walls of the interchange, and to irrigate other planting beds and lawn areas along the corridor and within the interchange area.

In 2023, the portion of this system west of the US-127 interchange was removed as part of the complete reconstruction of this section of M-20 by the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT). As part of the reconstruction, MDOT reinstalled PVC conduit in all of the reinstalled streetlight foundations and under all of the driveways to facilitate future reinstallation of this system. The remaining part of this irrigation system to the east of the interchange was not affected by the road reconstruction and remains in operation.
